To Mute yourself: In the lower left corner of the zoom screen, click the microphone icon






To use the chat box: If you have a question/comment at any point in the day, you can use the chat box function at the bottom of the screen and communicate with individuals or the group.

She leads efforts to advance nature under the SGMA, which includes developing the Groundwater Resource Hub to support inclusion of groundwater-dependent ecosystems in GSPs, a bird-friendly recharge pilot in Colusa, SGMA's first groundwater market in Ventura County and strategic retirement and upland habitat restoration in the San Joaquin Valley

Debi Ores, Senior Attorney, Community Water Center

Debi Ores joined the Community Water Center in 2014. As Senior Attorney, Debi is responsible for leading CWC's work on preventing nitrate contamination of drinking water sources. She also works on a number of other legislative and regulatory matters including implementation of the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act with a focus on ensuring disadvantaged communities are included in the decisions surrounding water management, water affordability, and promoting sustainable water systems. Debi received her B.A. in Political Science from UCLA. She obtained her J.D. from the University of California, Davis School of Law.

Craig Altare, Supervising Engineering Geologist, California Department of Water Resources

Mr. Altare is chief of the Groundwater Sustainability Plan Review Section in the Department of Water Resources' Sustainable Groundwater Management Office. He has 14 years of experience

in groundwater resources planning, management, and modeling in California. Mr. Altare has a BS in Geology from Virginia Tech and a MS in Hydrology from New Mexico Tech.

Natalie Stork, Chief of Groundwater Management Program, California State Water Resources Control Board

Natalie Stork is the Unit Chief for the State Water Board's Groundwater Management Program, which is responsible for the Board's implementation of SGMA. Prior to this role, Natalie worked as staff in the Groundwater Management Program, in the Enforcement Section of the Division of Water Rights, and in the private sector as a consultant. Natalie holds BS and MS degrees from UC Davis and the University of Connecticut and is a California registered Professional Geologist.

Catherine Freeman, Chief Consultant, California State Assembly Committee on Water, Parks, and Wildlife

Catherine Freeman has over 25 years of experience working in environmental, water, energy, land use, and housing policy. Ms. Freeman received her Bachelor of Arts in Environmental Studies and Economics from the University of California at Santa Cruz and her Master of Science in Science, Technology and Environmental Policy from the University of Minnesota. Her research and published topics have included reports on California water policy, infrastructure planning and bond financing, groundwater, air quality emission controls, and coastal land use policies. Ms. Freeman joined the California State Assembly in 2017 as Chief Consultant to the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee. From 2010 to 2017, she worked at the California State Senate as the Consultant to the Senate Budget and Fiscal Review Subcommittee on Resource, Energy and Environmental Policy. Previous to her work at the Senate, Ms. Freeman served as a Principal Fiscal and Policy Analyst to the California Legislative Analyst's Office, a nonpartisan fiscal advisor to the State Legislature.
